# II. Three characteristics of international organisations and their institutional decision-making processes that contribute to the authority of their instruments

- (i) the scientific and technical expertise of the organisation and other participants <u>epistemic</u> <u>authority</u>;
- (ii) the wide range of participants and capacity to generate shared understandings in broad and inclusive discursive processes interactional authority;
- (iii) the development of procedural and institutional norms necessary for implementation and compliance with existing obligations <u>regulatory authority</u>.
