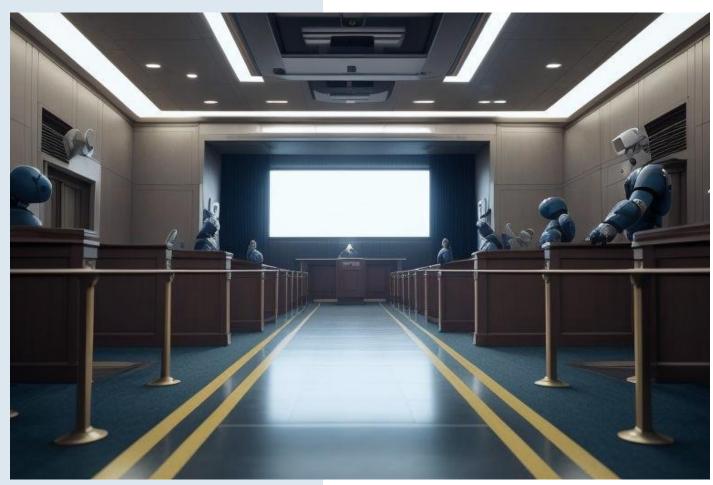

Contextualisation



("Robot judges" – generated by Perchance)

- Emergence of algorithmic and Al systems in the judiciary
 - Opportunities
 - Risks, including on the rule of law
 - Focus: the judicial duty to state reasons
- The judicial duty to state reasons
 - Key characteristics
 - Different functions
 - Normative goals: (i) legitimacy, (ii) transparency, (iii) accountability
- Potential adverse impact on the judicial duty to state reasons and its normative goals



Rethinking the judicial duty to state reasons

Different potential measures and approaches

How to enhance legitimacy, accountability and transparency of the judicial decision-making process?

- General measures: fostering Al literacy & avoiding outsourcing
- Specific / Radical: substantive duty to state reasons



Critical reflections

- Al literacy → concrete implementation?
- Outsourcing → realistic?
- Substantial duty → (too) many hurdles (?)
 - Which kind of explanations?
 - Access to software
 - Information overload / transparency paradox
 - Decreased trust in judiciary
 - Added workload and financial pressure
 - Undesirable accountability shift to judges
 - Unwanted consequence: ground of appeal
 - Constitutional constraints

Conclusion

- No straightforward answer
- Nuanced approach
- Other safeguards, overall fairness
